

The Orangeville Lions have successfully completed all three categories for the Lions International Legacy Program. The club has two signs on Murray's Mountain, a sign at their BMX Park and Lions Sports Park. The Sports Park, which is nearing completion, has been a shared project between Orangeville Parks and Recreation and the Orangeville Lions Club. The first phase was the completion of an outdoor sports pad which is being used year round for ball hockey. Just recently lights were installed so that the sports pad could be used after school during the short winter days. The town has added two soccer fields, washroom facilities, exercise equipment, playground equipment and a paved pathway. The Orangeville Lions have also been planting trees as part of their environmental program. The final phase is the construction of the Orangeville Lions Memorial Pavilion. The footings have been completed with the actual building will be completed later this month. The pavilion will be painted Lions colours and have a large sign added to the front side.

The third category is providing assistance to Headwaters Healthcare Centre which has been done in three ways. The Orangeville Lions annually make donations toward the "Healing Gardens" that beautify the grounds in and around the facility. The club also works as marshals for the annual Headwaters Bicycle Tour which generates thousands of dollars. The club just recently made a \$5000 donation towards a new defibrillator for the hospital.

Due to a clerical error the Orangeville Lions were not recognized at the November Cabinet Meeting for successfully completing the requirements for the Lions International Legacy Program.
